How we Communicate

We want to keep you informed. There are many ways we communicate with families and students:

- MacJournalism Our journalism program keeps us all informed through their MacJ • posts on Instagram (@macjournalism). They rarely miss an event or an important announcement. Note: if you don't have an Instagram account, the MacJournalism posts are worth getting an account and just following their posts.
- Blend Announcements Depending on the nature of the announcement, students and parents will receive Blend Announcements.
- Morning Announcements Our Mac Student Council does morning announcements, as well as a moment of silence and pledges, at the beginning of 2nd and 6th periods.
- MacKnightly eNewsletter Our wonderful Mac PTSA sends out a weekly newsletter called the MacKnightly Newsletter with important announcements. To sign up to receive this, please sign up at the bottom of this webpage: https://mccallumptsa.org/.
- Principal Update I send a Principal Update (like this one) about once a month. It serves to connect and highlight important information.
- Emails and Texts through School Messenger School Messenger is the system used by AISD to send group emails and text messages. Occasionally, parents have accidentally opted out of receiving these by indicating they would like their email made private. To check your settings, go to your Portal, click on the tile "Frontline SIS Self-Serve", click on the tab "Edit Contact Info", and scroll down to check that you have indicated "No" to making your email private (unless, of course, you'd like to opt out of emails)
- **Coffee/Tea with the Principal** Every month I hold a Morning Coffee with the Principal • and an Evening Tea with the Principal. We start each session with an update on all things Mac and then move to Q&A. I hold both the morning and evening with the hopes that one will fit your schedule, though you are always invited to attend both. These are typically held over Zoom but I plan on holding a few on campus this year as well.

What to do if (when) my student has a concern in the classroom?

We are in the business of people. We can expect that there will be differences of opinion, misunderstandings, confusion in communication, etc. What do you do when something happens? Please follow these steps when addressing a concern or misunderstanding.

- **STEP 1:** As often as possible, we want our students to practice advocating for themselves. The first step in addressing a concern is to encourage your student to speak with their teacher. Most problems can be resolved at this level and it is great practice for students to become advocates in their own lives.
- **STEP 2:** If you and your student feel there is still an issue, please email your teacher directly. You can find their contact information in the <u>AISD Directory</u> or by emailing through the Parent Portal Frontline Self-Service.
- **STEP 3:** The best next step is for the student or their parent to reach out to their support team of AP and/or counselor to help resolve the problem

Fall Austin Community College Dual Credit Update

Deadline to register for ACC courses is August 5 - no exceptions! After the 5th, if you have not fully registered for an ACC course, you will be dropped and placed in AP, OnRamps, or regular courses based upon your course history. Any student who indicated interested in a fall ACC course has received correspondence via email on how to fully register.

All of the steps outlined <u>HERE</u> must be completed in order for a student to take ACC courses.

Remember that on-campus ACC courses only get to happen if we have 16 students enrolled in each section. If your course doesn't make, you will be placed in AP, OnRamps, or regular courses.

Here is a checklist of tasks to accomplish prior to graduation:


- □ Apply to four year or two year school, enlist in the military, or apply to the workforce

Period Products at Mac



I have wonderful news! Austin ISD will now be providing free period products in all girls and gender neutral bathrooms. This is a great thing for all our students who experience periods at school. Drop Off & Pick Up at Mac

Sunshine Drive is used by AISD buses to drop off and pick up students who ride the bus. Because of this, Sunshine Drive from Houston to Stark is off limits to private transportation pick up in the afternoon. Our recommendation is that you communicate with your student a rendezvous location along Houston St. or Grover Ave. We don't recommend that students cross the street to get to their pick up vehicle. The traffic seems to be worse the first couple weeks of school. Let's be patient and treat each other with civility as we get our students home safely.



Parking - This Year will be an Adventure!

The good news is that construction of our new dance studio is starting soon. The bad news is that we will have less parking to accommodate construction materials and equipment. The lot directly north of the MAC Theatre (the biggest slashed circle on map above) will be blocked and we will not have those parking spaces. The large lot right along Koenig is available *after* the band finishes practicing in the morning at 8:30ish. Students would need to move their cars right at the end of school so the band can practice. I highly recommend carpooling this year. *Parking is very limited*.

My child has a doctor's appointment. How do I pick them up early from McCallum?

Parking is limited and our school is very spread out. We want to make the process of picking up your child early as simple as possible. Here is the easiest way to pick your child up early for an appointment:

- 1. Send a note in the morning with your student The note should include:
 - a. Reason for leaving
 - b. Time leaving
 - c. Student ID#
 - d. Parent phone number
 - e. Parent signature
- 2. Student should take the note to the office before school (or at their earliest convenience) and receive a pink slip from the main office.
- 3. Student will show the pink slip to their teacher.
- 4. Parent picks up student at the main entrance by the flag poles at the designated time.
- 5. Student brings their pink slip and their doctor's note back to the main office.

***If you follow these steps, there will be no need to find parking, come into the school, stand in a line, and wait for an office aide to retrieve your student. Woo hoo!
